

Rear Admiral, U.S. Navy, retired President.




International President

Captain Don Marcus is a professional mariner who became President of the International Organization of Masters, Mates & Pilots (MM&P) in January 2013. During his seagoing career he sailed in all Licensed Deck Officer capacities, from Third Mate to Master, aboard U.S.-flag ships in the international trade. He was commissioned in the U.S. Naval Reserve, receiving his Honorable Discharge in 1986. His last shipboard assignment was as Master of the MV Sea-Land Pacer

Don is a staunch advocate for the American Merchant Marine and America's working families. He has been a union member throughout his working life, having joined the Masters, Mates & Pilots upon graduating from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy

Pilots upon graduating from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point, NY, in 1979.



In June 2013, Don was elected President of the Maritime Labor Alliance, a six-union partnership which includes MM&P, the International Longshoremen's Association (ILA), the International Longshore and Warehouse Union (ILWU), the Inland Boatmen's Union (IBU), the Marine Engineers' Beneficial Association (MEBA) and the American Radio Association (ARA).

Don is a graduate of the University of California, Hastings College of the Law (1990) and has been admitted to the California Bar Association. Originally from San Francisco, he resides in Baltimore County, Maryland. He is married with three children.



About Masters, Mates and Pilots

Masters, Mates and Pilots was created to protect the rights and working conditions of members of the seagoing maritime community. The union fulfills its mission by representing MM&P members in

negotiations with shipowners, supporting the efforts of other maritime unions to achieve decent working conditions, and working with international organizations to improve standards and conditions in the global maritime community.

Masters, Mates and Pilots seeks to improve the maritime working environment through political action and involvement in the regulatory process that shapes laws and regulations governing maritime work. On the national level, Masters, Mates and Pilots represents the interests of mariners before Congress and the other governmental agencies that regulate shipping or whose decisions affect mariners, such as the U.S. Coast Guard, the Maritime Administration, the

Department of Defense and the Department of State. On the international level, because oceangoing shipping is regulated through United Nations organizations, **Masters, Mates and Pilots** actively participates in the work of the International Transport Workers Federation, representing the interests of all mariners at the International Maritime Organization and the International Labor Organization.

Captain Richard Phillips

Merchant Mariner, International Organization of Masters, Mates & Pilots, retired Author, "A Captain's Duty: Somali Pirates, Navy SEALs, and Dangerous Days at Sea"

"Steering Your Ship Through Rough Waters: Lessons on Leadership"

For five days in April 2009, Captain Richard Phillips became the center of an international drama when he was captured by Somali pirates who *attacked and boarded his ship, though never hijacked or controlled the ship.*

On Wednesday, April 8, a small band of pirates swung *a ladder* from their skiff onto the *Maersk Alabama*, a container ship ferrying food aid to East Africa. With the pirates firing at the vessels bridge as they climbed aboard, many of the crew scrambled into a designated safe room aboard the ship.

On the bridge, pirates held two sailors and Phillips at gunpoint, but the crew of 18 out maneuvered the four attackers. They managed to take the pirate leader hostage, wounding him in the hand with a knife, and regain control of the *Alabama*. The crew demanded the pirates leave the ship but they had scuttled their own small boat and demanded an escape boat, fuel and food.

Amid the standoff and already a hostage, Captain Phillips offered himself to get them off the *Maersk Alabama* putting him directly in harm's way, knowing full well that he might pay the ultimate price.

Once the pirates settled into one of the ship's covered lifeboats, the crew attempted to trade the pirate they had captured for Captain Phillips. They released their captive but the pirates refused to honor the agreement and fled with the captain. Held as a human shield in a small lifeboat with the four pirates, Phillips had little to hope for or cling to, except the knowledge that he had done everything he could to save the lives of the crew aboard his ship.

The U.S. Navy responded to the scene and negotiations were ongoing between the pirates and the captain of the USS Bainbridge. On Friday, April 10, Captain Phillips jumped out of the lifeboat swimming toward the destroyer but the pirates went after him and managed to haul him back in. The standoff dragged on until April 12, when Navy SEAL snipers saw one of the pirates aim his AK-47 at Captain Phillips's back and concluded he was in "imminent danger." On that Sunday morning, Navy SEAL snipers took remarkable shots and hit the three captors holding Captain Phillips. Within minutes, rescuers were on scene and Phillips was rescued off the lifeboat, and the three pirates were dead. They freed Captain Phillips, ending the sea catastrophe that had gathered much of the world's attention for many days.

President Barack Obama spoke with Captain Phillips by phone after he was released and said, "I share the country's admiration for the bravery of Captain Phillips and his selfless concern for his crew. His courage is a model for all Americans."

Captain Phillips is the author of "A Captain's Duty: Somali Pirates, Navy SEALs, and Dangerous Days at Sea," the story of his experience and his remarkable rescue. This dramatic story was also made into a motion picture by Columbia Pictures, starring Tom Hanks.

Captain Phillips is a 1979 graduate of the Massachusetts Maritime Academy, a member of the International Organization of Masters, Mates & Pilots Union, and a licensed American Merchant Mariner. He became Captain of the MV Maersk Alabama in 2008. Captain Phillips married Andrea Coggio in 1987. They have two children, Mariah and Danny, and reside in Underhill, VT.




Barbara Voulgaris is an avid historian and author on different aspects of the maritime industry, from extensive histories of the U.S. Coast Guard to preservation of the stories of World War II Merchant Mariners and their ships, artifacts and photographs.

Before MarAD, Voulgaris worked the Naval Historical Center in Washington, D.C. in a number of positions including cultural and for its Underwater Archaeology branch. She wrote a book on the *CSS Huntley* sinking and recovery. The *Huntley* was the Confederacy's infamous submarine.

Maritime Administration (MarAD), an agency of the U.S. federal government, administers the inactive ships in various reserve fleets and maritime artifacts. They are also the owners of NS Savannah, the only nuclear powered merchant vessel built by the USA.

The MarAD History Program is responsible for historical documentation and for the preservation and interpretation of its heritage assets to promote an understanding and appreciation of America's merchant marine and maritime past. Additionally, the History Program is responsible for MARAD's compliance with Federal laws and regulations applying to historic preservation.

Joe Coelho is a Vietnam veteran who retired after 30 years of active and reserve service in the U.S. Navy. He served on many types of warships, from frigates to nuclear-powered cruisers. While attached to the Military Sealift Command he worked

directly with merchant mariners and steamship companies, and sailed on Ro/Ros, dry cargo ships and tankers.

He has taught ethics at Fairfield University, strategy at the Naval War College and history at the Naval Academy. Additionally, he has taught sailing and navigation to recreational boaters on the Bay. For ten years Joe was chairman of a non-profit community correctional program and directly involved in fund raising, accreditation and staff training.

On the *Brown*, Joe is a member of the deck department and a life member of Project Liberty Ship. Museums are undergoing rapid changes due to maintenance / preservation costs, changing demographics and increased use of technology. Joe is pursuing a degree in museum studies at Johns Hopkins to strengthen and enhance the mission of Project Liberty Ship.

He is a member of the *Brown*'s Deck Department in addition to being the ship's training and security officer. Joe has been the Chairman of Project Liberty Ship since 2013.

Upon graduation from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in 1961, Mike Schneider went directly into the Navy and served for 24 years in diesel submarines and surface combatants, including command of a frigate.

He retired from the Navy in 1986 as a Captain and had a second career in the aerospace industry working as a program manager and manufacturing director for a company building small communications satellites.

He has been an active volunteer on the Liberty ship *John W. Brown* since 1988 working primarily in the engine room. He presently holds Coast Guard documentation as a fireman/watertender and sails in that capacity when the ship is underway.

Schneider served as chairman of Project Liberty Ship, the nonprofit that owns and operates the *Brown*, from 2002 to 2009.

About Project Liberty Ship S.S. John W. Brown

One of two surviving fully operational Liberty ships preserved in the United States, S.S. JOHN W. BROWN is the product of an emergency shipbuilding program in World War II that resulted in the construction of more than 2,700 Liberty ships.

Following her service in World War II, S.S. JOHN W. BROWN was loaned by the government to the Board of Education of the city of New York. From 1946 to 1983 she served as a floating maritime high school, training thousands of young men to be merchant mariners. Some of those former students have found their way back to the ship and now serve as volunteer crew members.

Project Liberty Ship is a dynamic, all-volunteer organization with the sole purpose of preserving the Liberty ship S.S. JOHN W. BROWN as an operating museum ship, with the primary focus of educating people of all ages about the nation's maritime

history during World War II and the vital role played by our merchant marine and military veterans.

United States Merchant Marine Serving our Nation in Peace and War

A tale of the first days of our country's merchant seamen

As dawn broke over Machias Bay, Maine, on June 12, 1775, forty men armed with guns, swords, axes and pitchforks and led by a revolutionary firebrand named Jeremiah O'Brien brought their private sloop, Unity, quietly around the lee side of Round Island. Their target, the British armed schooner Margaretta, immediately attempted to fire on the unarmed Unity, but Unity was too close. O'Brien commanded his crew to ram the British ship, boarded her and proceeded to engage in hand-to-hand combat. By the end of an hour, the British captain was mortally wounded, and the British ship had surrendered.

O'Brien and the Unity crew claimed four double fortified three-pounders, fourteen swivel guns and several smaller guns. Unity had become a warship for the soon to be proclaimed United States of America in this first sea engagement of the Revolutionary War. During the Revolutionary war, more than 11,000 Merchant Mariners died in service to our fledgling nation. They were the first to sacrifice their lives, but they would not be the last.

The War of 1812 was fought ostensibly because of the merchant marine. British warships were seizing American vessels on the high seas and impressed over 10,000 seamen into service for the British Navy or British merchant fleet. American ships were also being seized or sunk if they did not call at a British port before sailing to Europe. France responded by seizing ships that did stop at a British port. Because the United States had a limited number of Navy ships (23) the war

was mainly fought with merchant ships as privateers. America had 517 privateers during the War of 1812 and these privateers eventually captured 1,300 enemy ships worth nearly \$40 million.

That was a tremendous amount of money at the time considering that Alaska was bought for \$7.2 million and the Louisiana Purchase for \$12 million. This was the primary reason the British came to the peace table. It didn't end there though. Our country has since built up its own large Merchant Marine fleet and made its own sacrifices. During the first World War more than 700 merchant ships were sunk. Over 800 merchant ships were sunk during World War II. The Merchant Marine was present at Normandy, on D-Day, and all the other World War II invasions.

The Merchant Marine continues to serve the United States in both war and peace. It has done so proudly from the Revolutionary War to the present.
