Presentation of the Harvey-Wichita Award

The *Harvey-Wichita Award* was introduced at the 2017 AMMV National Convention. This award is first and foremost designed to honor by name Past National Presidents Morris Harvey and A.J. Wichita, both WWII veterans, who worked extremely hard for AMMV and gave so much over many years. This award is the highest level of recognition for organizational service to the AMMV, with recipients having displayed a level of excellence commensurate with the namesakes of this award. The criteria are:

- One annually presented to a WWII-era Merchant Mariner or member. This is a "lifetime achievement" award in terms of dedication to AMMV causes and USMM advocacy.
- One award annually to a post-WWII member. This is our "Man or Woman of the Year".
- This is a one-time award. Once presented, a recipient will be ineligible for future consideration.


